Graphic ART Design COURSE DESCRIPTION

Welcome to Computer Graphics. This class is an intermediate computer art class focused on the basics art elements; line, shape, space, value, form, texture, and color as well as the art principles; balance, proportion, emphasis, variety, movement, rhythm, harmony. Using these art elements students will create beautiful and inspiring works of art. To create our art we will be using the computers and Adobe imaging programs such as Photoshop and Illustrators, programs which are industry standards in the Graphic Design World.

RULES

Be respectful of all people in the classroom. Each student will be respectful of the teacher and will not impede classroom instruction through disruptive behavior or tardy entry to class. Be respectful of other students, and treat others in a mature and thoughtful manner.

Be respectful of the classroom and computers. Respect all the computers (even when you are frustrated). They are to be treated in a professional manner. Take proper care computer. Do not bang or . Do not write on the tables. Do not touch the printing presses, kilns, standing easels or other art tools without a teacher's permission. Graffiti will not be tolerated.

Effort. Students are expected to participate fully in all classroom activities. No student is expected to be an accomplished artist upon entry into the class. The expectation is that the student will develop skills through practice during the year. Students will use all class time for **ART** work only.

Horseplay in the classroom. No horseplay of any kind will be tolerated in the Art classroom. Horseplay endangers students and those around them as well as putting creative endeavors at risk.

Food. School policy states that food, and beverages are not allowed in the classroom. Students are not to bring those items into the classroom. I am not your mom and get really mad about picking up other people's trash!!!

Preparation. You will come into class and log on to computers and be ready to try your best.

Communication. If you are having a problem with this class do not assume that I know. It is your responsibility to communicate with me, so that you will have a successful experience. Class Dismissal and tarder entrance to class

1st offense: Visual/ verbal reminder by teacher

2nd offense: Discussion with teacher about infraction/possible detention

3rd offense: call home /detention

4th offense: referral

Grading

Grading policy: Each student is graded on an individual basis. No cross-class comparisons will be made. The majority of this class is based on project assessment. Which means that i am using the projects to check for understanding (like when other subjects use unit tests to check for understanding of the unit) of the art objectives per unit. **If a student does not hand in work, by uploading a jpeg picture to their shared google portfolio, they will receive a zero.** I cannot grade a blank slide. Sorry.

Extra Credit: for all projects if a student's uses their own photography (photos taken from a photo are ok as long as they are not grainy) rather than internet found photos in their artwork they will receive an additional 5 points.

Students quarterly grades are composed of 3 parts

70 % Project Grades

20% Do nows

10 % participation and behavior

Project Grades

each projects is graded against a rubric composed of 5 objectives each worth 20 points. The rubrics are provided at the beginning at the each project and the objectives are always on the project page

- To get a grade for your project the student must have it displayed on their portfolio that is shared with Mrs. Ras

Do Now Grade

approximately 2 times a week students are asked to complete a set of questions, 5 to 10 questions about some artwork or a short reading ect. The questions are designed to further or introduce art Techniques.

- To get a grade for the do nows student must answer the questions in their **do now slide show that is shared with Mrs. Ras**

Participation and behavior grade

this grade is given once at the end semester and based on the student's behavior and participation throughout the quarter. This component too has a rubric made up of 4 objectives, worth 25 points.

1. student worked diligently, always on task
2. Student is polite and respectful of both others and classroom
3. Student is on time for class and does not cut class
4. student is not disruptive

Attendance:

Absences & tardies interfere with your learning & success. So Be here, on time. If students arrive 5 min after the late bell you are considered late. (one min actually is late). You get a one time reminder. If it happens a second time you will get given a 15 min lunch detention (detention is served with me in 106) You have 2 days to serve that detention if you do not serve that detention a phone call will be placed home and will written up ie referral.
